

## Biography of Dr. Eyal Aharoni



Dr. Eyal Aharoni is an associate behavioral scientist at the RAND Corporation and forthcoming assistant professor at Georgia State University. His current research investigates the prediction and deterrence of antisocial behavior and the influence of extra-legal factors on legal decisionmaking. He has a particular interest in how multiple approaches (cognitive, behavioral, evolutionary, technological, and neurobiological) to these topics may apply to criminal responsibility, jurisprudence, and mental health treatment policy. He also has methodological and management experience in survey research, experimental research, and longitudinal follow-up studies. Eyal completed a postdoctoral fellowship with appointments at The MIND Research Network for Neurodiagnostic Discovery and the University of New Mexico Psychology. He has also held research positions at the Research Center for Virtual Environments and Behavior and the Institute for Social, Behavioral, and Economic Research, where he studied human-computer social interaction and the perception of agency. Eyal earned bachelor's degrees in psychology and religious studies from the University of California, Santa Barbara (UCSB). He earned his Ph.D. in psychology at UCSB where he also served as a research fellow for the MacArthur Foundation's Law and Neuroscience Project.
