CRIMINAL JUSTICE ACT BOARD ANNOUNCES APPLICATION DEADLINE FOR BOSTON, SPRINGFIELD, AND HABEAS CJA PANELS

The Federal District Court Criminal Justice Act Board will accept applications for approximately (40) positions on the present District Court panel list for appointment to indigent cases in Boston. The Board will accept applications for a limited number of positions on the Springfield CJA panel.

The CJA Board also is soliciting applications for a panel representing habeas petitioners. The pilot program for a supplemental panel for habeas corpus representation was announced in June 2007. There is a supplemental application form for those attorneys interested in being considered for this relatively small panel.

In June of 1993, the Federal District Court approved a list of attorneys to serve staggered terms on the panel for Boston. Appointments for approximately one-third of this group will expire on December 31, 2012. The District Court now maintains three separate panels for appointments from the Boston, Springfield and Worcester offices and an additional panel for habeas representation. Anyone who is interested in becoming a member of the Boston or Springfield panel should submit an application and writing sample to the Clerk's Office, and email a copy of the application and writing sample as separate pdf files to cja@mad.uscourts.gov by October 10, 2012. Those interested in becoming a member of the Habeas Panel should also complete the Supplemental Habeas Panel Application and submit the original and email a copy by October 10, 2012.

A panel member must meet the following minimum criteria:

- 1. Be a member in good standing of the bar of the United States District Court for the District of Massachusetts and the bar of the Supreme Judicial Court.
- 2. Be registered for the Court's electronic case filing system CM/ECF which became mandatory on January 1, 2006.
- 3. Have at least five years experience as a member of the bar.
- 4. Have sufficient experience to furnish high quality representation to criminal defendants in Federal Court.
- 5. Be familiar with (a) the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure; (b) the Federal Rules of Evidence; (c) the Bail Reform Act of 1984, as amended; and (d) the Federal Sentencing Guidelines.
- 6. Demonstrate an interest and experience in the practice of criminal law, or have other equivalent experience.

- 7. For Boston panel attorneys, agree to take part in the duty day system.
- 8. Agree to take appointment on the full range of CJA cases.
- 9. Agree to attend continuing legal education programs.

In developing a recommended list, the Board intends to focus on demonstrated ability to provide able representation. While it is expected that most of those recommended for the CJA panel will have prior experience in criminal cases, such experience is not essential.

From among those considered to be well-qualified, the Board will seek to recommend a CJA panel which is sensitive to the diversity of the defendant population it will be serving and to ensure that women are fully represented in the panel's membership.

The Board is especially interested in receiving applications from attorneys with Spanish language skills. For attorneys who lack criminal defense experience in Federal Court, the Board operates a mentoring program.
